Walsall Walk On

A free, led walking scheme across Walsall borough, held in parks, green spaces, and countryside areas. Walks are led by trained walk leaders with a back marker to ensure safety, pacing and group inclusion. They are ideal for building fitness, encouraging social connections and improving both physical and mental wellbeing. Several walks make use of the canal network in Walsall. A good example is the one from Aldridge Airport on a Wednesday morning which often uses the Rushall Canal as part of the route. Simply turn up at the start location 15 minutes before the start time.

GIVE A GIRL A BIKE

Based at Willenhall Memorial Park, Give a Girl a Bike runs FREE weekly cycling sessions. The group encourages women and children to get out on their bikes, catering for all abilities. It offers the opportunity to discover new places to cycle in the Black Country and beyond, helps them gain confidence as a group and make new friends - and most of all have fun. That's the power of riding together. The guided bike rides go around the Willenhall area and other parts of Walsall, sometimes using the canal network.

WALSALL ARBORETUM COMMUNITY CYCLE CLUB

With its social group rides, led by Cycling UK trained ride leaders, the club aims to make cycling accessible to all adults in Walsall. The adults-only group meets every Tuesday morning 10am-12.30pm at the clock tower by the main entrance to the Walsall Arboretum. Designed to boost confidence, health and wellbeing, led rides out of the park are mostly off road - and on a few quiet roads for confident cyclists. Bikes and helmets are provided free of charge or you can bring your own. Bring some photo ID to register at your first session. The group is part of British Triathlon's Swim Bike Run/Walk programme.

COUCH TO 5K

A free, 12-week running course, following the NHS Couch to 5K framework (with a two-week extension) to support gradual progression into running 5km. Led by qualified Jog Walsall Leaders (wearing bright orange tops), trained in Leadership in Running Fitness, some are also England Athletics coaches. Designed for complete beginners or those easing back into running - for physical, mental and social wellbeing. The sessions from Oak Park Active Living Centre on a Tuesday evening use the Daw End Branch canal in Walsall Wood as part of their running route, which links the active living centre to Clayhanger Common.
